- 2. **Welfare and Benefits Section:** Coordinates and disburses welfare and benefits so that persons with disabilities receive equal rights and entitlements.
- 3. **Training and Development Section:** Coordinates access to training and self-development opportunities for persons with disabilities, ensuring equal opportunities with other staff.
- 4. **Rules and Regulations Section:** Oversees and ensures that staff members treat persons with disabilities appropriately and respectfully.
- 5. **Payroll Section:** Responsible for disbursing salaries and compensation to staff with disabilities.
